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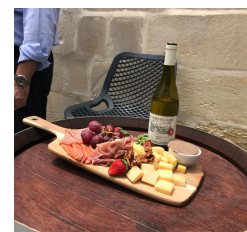

A CONSULTANCY PROJECT



As part of the “Innovative Cooperation Business-HEI Learning Model for Tourism” 3 year project that Malta University Consulting Ltd in collaboration with Malta Business Bureau have been awarded, a Focus Group was organised on 4th September 2018 at Dar Guzeppi Zahra, University of Malta. The topic identified and discussed was the narrowing of the existing gap in Soft Skills in graduate staff employed in the Tourism & Hospitality Industry. Representatives from the tourism & hospitality business sectors and academics from the Institute of Tourism, Travel & Culture of the University of Malta (the project associate partner) were brought together to work on an exercise highlighting the most important soft skills needed for this sector and how to improve upon the current student placements to exploit better the learning model.
