




The Become A Better Condominium Administrator Course was held between the 25th of September and the 9th of October to a full class of thirty highly-engaged participants.

FOCUS ON PERSONNEL David Fabri Director of MUHC



David Fabri LL.D., Ph.D. (Melit) serves as a director on the board of the MUHC and related companies.

He has lectured various subjects at University since 1994 first on a part-time basis and later, since 2015, on a full-time basis. He currently heads the Department of Commercial Law. His main areas of academic interest include consumer law, corporate law, financial services legislation, regulation and regulators, whistle-blowing and business ethics. He teaches these subjects in different Faculties at both under-graduate and post-graduate levels.

Dr Fabri graduated in law in 1979 from the University of Malta with a doctorate thesis on consumer law in Malta. His Ph.D. thesis, 35 years later, analysed the various contexts which influenced the way Malta transposed the European Union Consumer Directives during the period from 1990 to 2004. He worked for ten years with a leading audit firm and later worked at the Malta Financial Services Authority, and its previous incarnations, for 23 years.

During his time at University, Dr Fabri served on what was then called the Entertainments Committee (which inter alia organized weekly discos at Students House) and won various Inter-Faculty Cups representing both the Arts and Laws teams. He also captained the University Football team.

For the past two years he has served as the Sport Mentor within the Faculty of Law whose role is to assist student-athletes be better able to manage their international sporting engagements with their academic commitments. This is in line with the University's Student-Athlete Sports Programme.

His main hobbies include reading, especially history, playing football and sixties rock music. He collects Melitensia, especially books, but also old Maltese and foreign posters, tourist brochures, local soft drink bottles and related advertising material.
